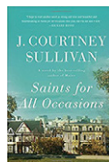

There's all of the intrigue and power-plays you'd expect from an episode of *Game of Thrones*, plus we get to dive deep into the competing theologies in Israel as the monarchy arose, as well as the political and theological perspectives of the author of 1 Samuel.**

**Our June Sermon series, "Just Like The Other Kids: Israel Wants a King, too" will help us ask questions about what it means to hear God's Call; What it means to be part of a community of faith and a wider society, and how we keep the faith when we struggle with the consequences of our decisions.**
