Q. What are your hobbies/interests?

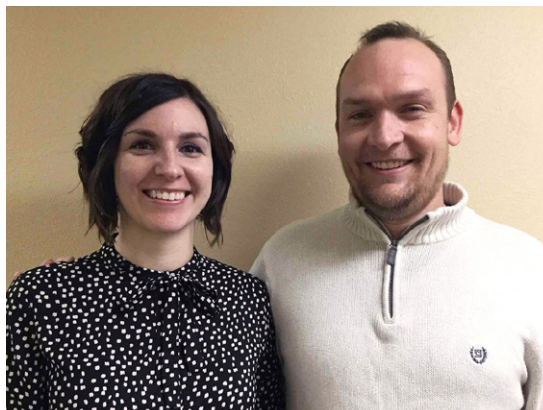
A. I love reading, hunting for the best sweet tea in town, and visiting public libraries in new cities.
