What Shall We Bring? An Invitation to Generosity

Every year, about this time, we spend time as a community considering what it means to be generous, what it means to be catalysts of change in our community, and what it means to follow God's call.

This year, we're considering what this all means by asking the question "What Shall We Bring?"

Each of the words in this question offers us a good bit to reflect upon:

WHAT: Each of us has something, perhaps many things, we can bring to God in service. Our financial resources help us build the sort of world we believe God dreams of, but we have other things—our talents, our gumption, our strengths—to draw upon. WHAT reminds us that we have a choice. Let's choose wisely!

SHALL: Generosity is an opportunity, a choice. Shall expresses the future tense. It points to possibility! SHALL reminds us that the opportunity we're invited to will reveal the



possibilities of what our community of Disciples is capable of when we answer God's call.

WE: As the Church, we share a collective call. It's always about what WE can do as a people committed to learning how to be the Body of Christ. You and I have the opportunity to work together, and God is always with us—making our WE even bigger than we can imagine!

BRING: Nothing we hope for, nothing God hopes for, happens because of passivity. We are called to be, to stretch, to hope for something far beyond what we are already doing. God calls us, like so many people of the faith before us, to journey out in faith. To respond to an invitation of generosity means we recognize that all of things we have are things that we might BRING.

This is our question during this season, friends.

I look forward to figuring out our answertogether.
